

1. What is Simplicity Clan Creator?

Simplicity Clan Creator is a program designed to let you create a clan on Battle.Net using 10 Warcraft III keys with very little configuration. This is for the most part an automated clan creator because you don't need 10 separate Warcraft III clients, or 10 separate bots. It can all be done within the program itself. It will attempt to make sure that at least 10 keys are unclanned and can be used to create a clan.




This is the main window of Simplicity

2. What do I need?


You will need your own list of Warcraft III keys to create a clan. Don't worry if some of them are clanned, as long as at least 10 of them are working. Place them in CD-Keys.txt in the root folder (If this file doesn't exist, create it or run the program, and it will make the file for you). You will also need proxies (Simplicity supports SOCKS4 and HTTP proxies), as well as Warcraft III

hashes. The program will not start without the Warcraft III hashes in the WAR3 folder.


You can add more keys and proxies while the program is running. If you want to add more keys, add them to CD-Keys.txt and then click "Reload Keys" to add them to Simplicity. If you want to add more proxies, add them to SOCKS4.txt or HTTP.txt and then click "Reload Proxies".



If you run Simplicity for the first time it will create a CD-Keys.txt file for you

This error shows up when you run Simplicity without hashes and the WAR3 folder has been automatically created for you.


3. Features of the program

This program will check your keys and dump the bad keys to BadKeys.txt, and the in use keys to InUseKeys.txt. It will also detect clanned keys, and place them in ClannedKeys.txt. It will work in such a way as to provide minimal overhead for creating the next clan (should you do it on the same realm). Once you create a clan those keys won't be used again so if you have enough keys you can keep creating clans on the same realm or create a clan on other realms.


It will take the initiate name (up to 14 characters), and add 1-9 to the end of it to specify the initiates that are used to create the clan. However, you can also specify custom initiates to make the clan with instead of the 9 specified by the initiate name. When all the custom initiates run out, then Simplicity will switch to automatically generating the 1-9 at the end of the initiate name.

It will also work with voided keys where your friend's list cannot maintain the 9 initiates. When it checks the clan tag, if there are any problems in regards to the chieftain not having all 9 initiates on its friends list, then Simplicity will allow you to remove all the excess friends off the chief's friends list. Then Simplicity will add the remaining initiates to the friend's list, and

continue checking the clan tag.

4. Setting up the program

Simplicity is just like the name implies, simple to setup. Just run it, after placing the Warcraft III hashes in the WAR3 folder, and adding proxies and keys to their respective places. Everything on the GUI should be self explanatory. Simply fill in the information. Additionally, you can tick "Save clan configuration to file on exit" to have Simplicity save your information for the next time you run it.
